Evaluation Comments

What were the instructor's strengths? Weaknesses?

- He was well organized and extremely knowledgeable on the topics.
- Prof. Craze stimulated really interesting discussions during class and he was clearly extremely knowledgeable on all the subject matter. However, office hours were sometimes hard to schedule, understandably because he was teaching two sections without a TA; even when we went to office hours, they were sometimes a little limited in length per student slot. He should seriously consider getting a TA for future quarters or years, since I think it would be really helpful for students especially for helping students out with drafts of essays, grading, etc. Also, I think that I can see why many people struggled with the essays, especially first years for whom these may be some of the first essays in college they've ever written; I think a little more instruction on how to write essays and expectations for essays would be really helpful.
- Joshua may be the smartest person with who I have ever spoken. He knew the readings back to front, literally. He was chock-full of funny anecdotes about his life and his English accent made listening easy. The only drawback was sometimes he would employ French phrases which no one understood, or he assumed we were familiar with something with which we were not. But this mostly served to make the class more interesting. A fantastic instructor.
- Incredibly elegant in his explanations. He did not reveal all the secrets of the text. Instead, he led us through and would provide insight from time to time. When he did, it was beautifully worded and helpful for both my understanding of the text and my interest in the material. The prompts for Marx and Durkheim were also very thought provoking. Difficult to respond to without really thinking about the question. I didn't like the prompt for Smith nearly as much though

What, if anything, what would you change about this course and why?

- Less reading but a closer reading of parts of the texts. The amount of reading was ridiculous and we couldn't even get into the richness of the texts at the pace that we went.
- Our class was a little dead sometimes, probably because there was just way too much reading to get through in a single class sometimes (though this is not necessarily Prof. Craze's fault since he didn't get to write the syllabus this year). I'm assuming he'll revise the syllabus to either reflect a more appropriate amount of reading (read: less), or if the same amount of reading is assigned, at least to point out the most important parts of the reading we should especially focus on.
- Shorter reading. We read so much that it actually worked against our understanding of the texts.
- More questions to guide us through the readings
