#### The Course

#### What are the most important things that you learned in this course? Please reflect on the knowledge and skills you gained.

- Joshua is honestly an amazing professor. He is one of the more demanding teachers in the Power Section but his class is always so engaging.
- I learnt the political thoughts of several western major thinkers from 17th century to 19th century, and also how their thoughts interact, complement, or conflict with each other.
- Some canonical texts in political philosophy were studied. Many interesting questions about freedom, political structures, and legitimacy were raised, and I think the answers in the text, found to be not entirely straightforward but lending themselves to different interpretations, improved my ability to interpret or process texts.
- I learned how to write argumentative papers and how to really engage with a classroom discussion. Also, I've started to learn how to read difficult texts, and gain an understanding of basic political theory.

#### Describe how aspects of this course (lectures, discussion, assignments, etc.) contributed to your learning.

- I think the lectures were the best part. We would always have a very good discussion led by Joshua but then he would also go off a bit and talk to us.
- The discussions and lectures in class have been very useful in terms of clarifying concepts in the books and deepening understanding of the authors' thoughts. Writing essays in response to the challenging writing prompts further solidify that understanding. The large amount of reading for each assignment also improved my critical thinking skill and reading comprehension.
- This was a very discussion-based class. Joshua made sure to always balance letting people voice their questions and concerns with explaining the core of the material that he felt was necessary to be explained. There were three papers assigned, and the two so far that I've completed have challenged me--but Joshua was always more than willing to offer support.

#### What could she/he modify to help you learn more?

- Sometimes because the assignment is consisted of a large amount of reading, we don't cover all we read in class. It would be more helpful if, instead of skipping over those portions of the readings, the professor just briefly comments on those portions not discussed.
- We had groups to discuss the essay topic starting with the second essay; I feel that in the future, Professor Craze could introduce the groups earlier in the quarter. Also, this isn't the instructor's fault, but whoever assigned the readings for Power needs to MAKE THEM SHORTER. Lastly, for certain topics, Joshua's style of going very in depth worked very well (like

for Hobbes and Rousseau), but for certain writers, like Mill, I think a more general overview would have helped us more (instead of going in depth for the first 15 pages, we could have discussed key sections from each of the five parts of the book).
