- Sometimes I regret taking Joshua's class because he significantly raised my expectations of professors at large. Many strengths: 1) Unbelievably intelligent and well-read, knows all course materials and beyond by heart, gives us optional supplemental readings which I find very helpful; 2) Excellent at facilitating class discussions, assigns thought-provoking prompts which could be difficult and nevertheless/therefore fun to write about; 3) Extremely responsible and dedicated, really cares about students and very generous in giving office hours (one-on-one and extra group office hours for essays);4) Some personality perks: could appear a little intimidating at the beginning, but soon proved to be nice and laid-back (probably except for academic requirements). Besides, Joshua is truly passionate about what he teaches, and that just gives him an incredible charisma. To sum up: Joshua is phenomenal. Class experience with him is as enjoyable and worthwhile as itâ??s intense. Joshua is not the type of professors who coddle students, but he's THE choice if one wants to get 200% out of SOSC.
